Program Planning Committee Report to be considered at Convention, June 2-4, 2017, Seattle WA

Submitted by Michelle Valentine, Ann Murphy and input from 12 local Leagues.

The Proposed Program is recommended by the LWVWA Board of Directors

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LWVWA Board of Directors recommends the following program for the next biennium to provide material for citizen education and action by local leagues:

1. Promote public education and action concerning the status of the health care coverage in Washington state subsequent to the end of the 2017 Legislative session and any resultant fallout from federal actions.

**Scope:** Continue efforts resulting in an ongoing action campaign to educate the public about a universal healthcare plan and its comparison to the ACA.

Outlook for Work – 1 year to survey needs and then create action plan for materials for local meetings and supporting Lobby Team.

2. Update the current LWVWA Position HC-1 to focus on behavioral health status with a survey of the status of behavioral health diagnosis, treatment, in-patient and out-patients facilities, and state housing needed in WA state.

**Scope:** Complete study with recommendations for any changes in state fiscal support of behavioral health services.

**Outlook for Work** – One year study with materials ready for local League study and consensus in Fall 2018

**Background:** Program in Action 2015-17 has a 1 page summary on health care that focuses on universal access and seamless coverage regardless of one's health status. It does not address behavioral health. At the LWVUS 2016 Convention, delegates adopted a behavioral health concurrence with the LWV Colorado position (see Impact on Issues, page 85.)
