Bills Seeing Action This Week

Various bills that had public hearings in the first two weeks of the legislative session will have executive session committee deliberations this coming week.

Additionally, HB 1099, improving the state's climate response through updates to the state's comprehensive planning framework – which is one of League's priority bills – having passed the House, will have a hearing already in the Senate this coming week.

Several of the priority bills had public hearings last week and are awaiting executive session decisions in their respective committees.

The following bill will have a public hearing in the week ahead, for which it would be helpful to have people sign in to support it.
