

Weekly Legislative Update: Growth Management

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Coming Up This Week

When you sign in "Pro", you may express support for bills in hearings with the online process. Remember, only authorized members can speak for the League; the Issue Chairs will do that, so please leave the "Organization" box blank. A more powerful influence is many voices speaking for themselves rather than many voices speaking for the League.

SB 5203/HB 1181 Improving the state's response to climate change by updating the state's planning framework. SB 5203 had a public hearing in the Senate Local Government, Land Use and Tribal Affairs Committee on January 17 and is scheduled for executive session on February 9. HB 1181 was passed out of the House Local Government Committee as a substitute bill and referred to the House Appropriations Committee, where it has a public hearing on Monday, February 6. Sign in PRO here before 3:00 pm on Monday.

Updates

SB 5190/HB 1110 Increasing middle housing in areas traditionally dedicated to single-family detached housing. SB 5190 was passed from the Senate Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs on January 12 and referred to the Senate Housing Committee, where it had a public hearing on January 25. It has now been scheduled for executive session on Wednesday, February 8.

HB 1110 has been scheduled for executive session in the House Housing Committee on February 7.

<u>HB 1401</u> Allowing cities and counties to create a simple, standardized housing permit process for affordable housing units in areas designated for housing. This bill was moved out of the House Housing Committee on February 2 with a Do Pass recommendation.

<u>SB 1425</u> Facilitating municipal annexations, would requires an interlocal agreement for annexed areas in which a sales and use tax is imposed to address certain criteria regarding loss and gain of revenue, development and ownership of infrastructure, and revenue sharing agreements. This bill had a public hearing in the House Local Government Committee on

February 1 and executive action was taken on February 3 but the action taken is not available as of this writing.

<u>HB 1611</u> Local government permitting. This bill had a public hearing in the House Housing Committee on January 30 and is scheduled for executive session on February 7.

HB 1620 Concerning the number of inhabitants required for incorporation as a city or town would remove the requirement that an area must have at least 3,000 inhabitants, instead of the otherwise standard 1,500, to incorporate if it is within 5 air miles of a city with a population of 15,000 or more. This bill had a public hearing in the House Local Government Committee on February 1 and executive action was taken on February 3 but the action taken is not available as of this writing.

<u>SB 5466</u> Promoting transit-oriented development, had a public hearing in the Senate Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs Committee on January 31 and is scheduled for executive session on Tuesday, February 7.

<u>SB 5456</u> **Minimum Parking Requirements** had a public hearing in the Senate Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs Committee on February 2 and is scheduled for executive session on Thursday, February 9.

HB 1133/SB 5357 Establishing limitations on detached accessory dwelling units outside urban growth areas. (Recall that League is watching this, in case it is amended to allow more than nominal change in rural areas.) HB 1133 had a public hearing on January 19 and was passed out of the House Housing Committee as a substitute bill on January 26. It is now in the House Rules Committee. SB 5357 had a public hearing in the Senate Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs Committee on January 26 but has not been scheduled for executive session.

<u>HB 1167</u> Concerning residential housing regulations, had a public hearing in the House Housing Committee on January 19 and executive action was taken but the action was not specified as of this writing.

<u>HB 1245</u> Increasing housing options through lot splitting, a companion bill to SB 5364 listed below, had a public hearing in the House Housing Committee and was moved out of committee with a Do Pass recommendation on February 2.

HB 1351/SB 5364 Encouraging transit-oriented development through a prohibition on the imposition of minimum parking requirements. HB 1351 had a public hearing in the House Local Government Committee on January 25 but has not been scheduled for executive session. SB 5364 was moved out of the Senate Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs Committee as a substitute with a Do Pass recommendation and is now in Senate Rules Committee.

<u>SB 5235</u> Concerning accessory dwelling units. This bill had an executive session in the Senate Local Government, Land Use & Tribal Affairs Committee on Thursday, February 2 but no action was taken.

<u>SB 5412</u> Reducing local governments' land use permitting workloads. This bill had a public hearing on January 26 and is scheduled for executive session on February 7.
