

# Weekly Legislative Update: Health Care

As we continue to move quickly through the session many bills will begin to be heard in Executive session while others will only now begin to be heard in committee. A priority healthcare bill is SB 5179 which will be heard this week.

(You may express support for bills in hearings with the online process as citizens. Remember, only authorized members can speak for the League; the Issue Chairs will do that, so please leave the "Organization" box blank. A more powerful influence is really to have many voices speaking for themselves rather than many voices speaking for the League.)

#### Take Action:

**SB 5179 Increasing access to the provisions of the Death with Dignity Act.** This is a companion bill to HB 1281 described below which was introduced in the house this past week and has been championed by Rep. Skylar Rude for many years. This senate bill is sponsored by Senator Pederson and nineteen others. This bill will face opposition principally due to religious beliefs. The League has supported this bill over many years. The bill will be heard on February 2<sup>nd</sup> at 10:30am, take action prior to 9:30 am that day.

#### **Senate Bills**

**SB 5036 Concerning telemedicine.** This is a companion bill to HB 1027. Sponsored by Senator Muzzall.

- **SB 5103** Concerning payment to acute care hospitals for difficult to discharge Medicaid patients. Patients in hospitals in small communities are waiting to be discharged to other placement such as a nursing home bed. This bill will protect these hospitals which smaller and rural communities cannot afford to lose. Sponsored by Senator Muzzall. There was a comprehensive work session, and the bill had a public hearing in the Health and Long-Term Care Committee on 1/17/23.
- SB 5241 Concerning material changes to the materials and operation structure of participants in the healthcare marketplace (previously Keep Our Care Act (KOCA)). Sponsored by Senator Randall and sixteen others, this bill seeks to limit mergers and acquisitions of hospitals and healthcare facilities. Passage gives the Attorney General further legal grounds to investigate and intervene in cases where takeover of a secular healthcare facility limits choice in personal healthcare decision making. This is particularly of concern in end of life, gender affirming care and the whole of reproductive healthcare. This bill was heard in the Senate Law & Justice committee on 1/24/23 and has been scheduled for a continued public hearing on 1/27/23 at 8am.
- **SB 5242 Prohibits cost sharing for abortion.** Sponsored by Senator Cleveland and sixteen others. Companion bill to HB 1115 (description for this bill is provided above) was heard in Senate Law & Justice 1/24/23 and waiting for executive session.
- SB 5260 Protecting and assisting Washington employers providing access to or benefits for reproductive healthcare services. Sponsored by Senator Keiser and sixteen others. A companion bill to HB 1286. Bill description is provided with the house bill. It is was heard in Senate Labor & Commerce 1/24/23.
- **SB 5400** Concerning actions by health professions' disciplining authorities against license holders and applicants. This bill seeks to protect healthcare license holders or applicants from having action taken against them for providing gender affirming or reproductive healthcare. Sponsored by Senator Salomon and sixteen others.
- **SB 5489 Concerning access to reproductive health care services and gender affirming treatment in Washington state.** Sponsored by Senator Trudeau and Wellman and thirteen others. This bill provides legal protections for individuals who provide or receive protected health care services from lawsuits or criminal cases commenced in other states. This is a companion bill to HB 1469. It was heard in committee in Senate Law & Justice 1/24/23; was heard in Executive Committee on 1/26/23 at 8am and received a Do Pass Recommendation.
- **SB 5499 Concerning the multistate nursing licensure compact**. A bill sponsored by Senator Mullet and six others would seek changes in existing law to allow Washington state to cooperate with other states so that Registered Nurses with a Washington license or a nurse from another state with a compact agreement could practice in Washington.

**SJR 8202 Senate Joint Resolution.** Amending the State Constitution to address reproductive freedom. This resolution will require passage by two-thirds of the membership in both the House and Senate and if passed will be voted on by the voters in the next general election. Sponsored by Senators Keiser and Kuderer and fourteen others. This bill had a public hearing in Senate Health & Long-term Care Committee on 1/24/23 at 8am.

#### **House Bills**

**HB 1027 Concerning telemedicine**. Extending the Telemedicine time frame option (until 01/2017) in which real-time telemedicine using both audio and video technology may be used and has important consequences for the underserved, frail, and elderly especially in rural communities. This bill was moved to the committee on health and healthcare. Sponsored by Representative Riccelli and eighteen others. It was heard in executive session.

<u>HB 1115</u> Cost Sharing for Abortions. Sponsored by Representative Bateman and seventeen others. This bill seeks to end the practice of copays and coinsurance preventing some women from obtaining abortion care. See companion bill SB 5242 which was heard in committee on 1/24/23.

**HB 1222 Requiring coverage for hearing Instruments.** This bill passed out of the house and is scheduled for executive session this week. Sponsored by Representative Orwall and sixteen others. Scheduled for Executive session on 1/27/23 at 8 am in Health and Wellness.

HB 1035 Prohibiting healthcare entities from restricting certain healthcare services by health care providers. This bill clarifies that health care providers have agency in what services can be provided if they are within scope of practice and approved by Department of health (DOH). We will be following this bill as we look for amendments. Sponsored by Representative Walen.

HB 1263 Concerning material changes to the materials and operation structure of participants in the healthcare marketplace (previously Keep Our Care Act (KOCA). Companion Bill to SB 5241 (Described below). This bill is sponsored by Representatives Simmons, Stonier, Macri and Pollet in the house. This bill has been referred to the Civil Rights and Justice Committee. Please see Companion Bill SB 5241 which was heard in committee 1/24/23.

**HB 1281** Increasing access to the provisions of the Death with Dignity Act. Sponsored by Representative Rude and twenty-one others. Heard and passed out of committee and scheduled for Executive session on 2/2/23 at 8am in Health & Wellness.

**HB 1340** Concerning actions by health professions' disciplining authorities against license holders and applicants. This is a companion bill to SB 5400 described above. Sponsored by Representative Riccelli and twenty-four others.

**HB 1469 Concerning access to reproductive services and gender affirming treatment in Washington state.** Sponsored by Representatives Hansen and Thai and twenty-five others. This bill was referred to the House Civil Rights & Judiciary Committee for a hearing on 1/24/23 and is now scheduled into Executive Session on 1/27/24 at 10:30 am.

HJR 4201 House Joint Resolution. This is a companion bill to SJR 8202 which was heard in the Senate Health and Long-Term care committee on 1/24/23. Sponsored by Representative Gregerson and thirty-four others and is currently in the House Healthcare and Wellness committee.

### **Bills We Oppose**

**SB 5098 Prohibiting abortion based on Down syndrome.** This bill was sponsored by Senator Padden and three others. (The companion bill is **HB 1379**.) The bill seeks to control a person's freedom to make medical choices and interferes with an individual's bodily autonomy.

SB 5184 Considering Anesthesia Assistants. This bill is sponsored by Senator Rivers and six others. (The companion bill is HB 1038.) This bill seeks a new classification of assistants to anesthesiologists. This bill instead of lifting and supporting Certified Nurse Anesthetists (CRNAs) who are critical to the existing healthcare workforce especially in rural communities, has the potential to undermine them. CRNAs are an independent and well-established profession with an exemplary educational program at Gonzaga. Had a public hearing on 1/20/23. No executive action yet.

#### How You Can Be Involved
