

## Weekly Legislative Update: Early Care and Education

Again, good news to report. The early care and education bills we have been supporting passed the Senate or House by the March 8 deadline and now go to the opposite chamber.

One bill, <u>HB 1199</u>, licensed child care in common interest communities, had a positive public hearing in the Senate Law & Justice Committee on March 9 at 8:00 am.

Two early care and education bills are scheduled for public hearing this week:

- 2SSB 5225 to increase access to child care subsidies (Working Connections Child Care or WCCC) is scheduled for public hearing in House Human Services, Youth & Early Learning on March 14 at 1:30 pm. It's scheduled for executive session March 17 at 8:00 am. This bill would prohibit the state from considering immigration status in determining eligibility for WCCC and make it easier for homeless families to retain child care subsidies.
  - You can help by signing-in <u>PRO</u> on 2SSB 5225 by 12:30 pm on March 14.
- HB 1525 would provide eligibility for WCCC for the first 12 months of enrollment in a state registered apprenticeship program. This bill is scheduled for public hearing on March 13 at 1:30 pm in the Senate Early Learning & K-12 Education Committee.
  - To support this bill, sign-in PRO by 12:30 pm on March 13.
