Congratulations to Kim Wyman

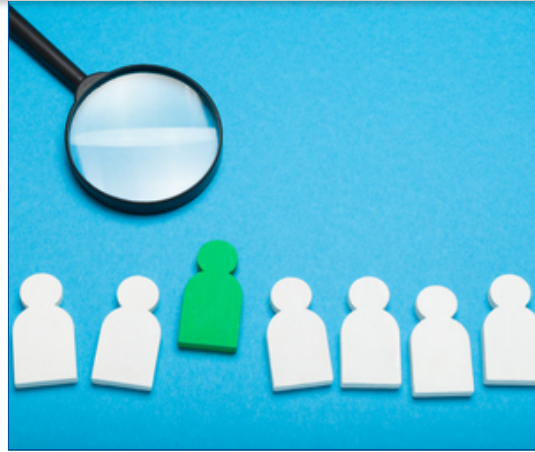
