1.7 SAT | Speak Up School

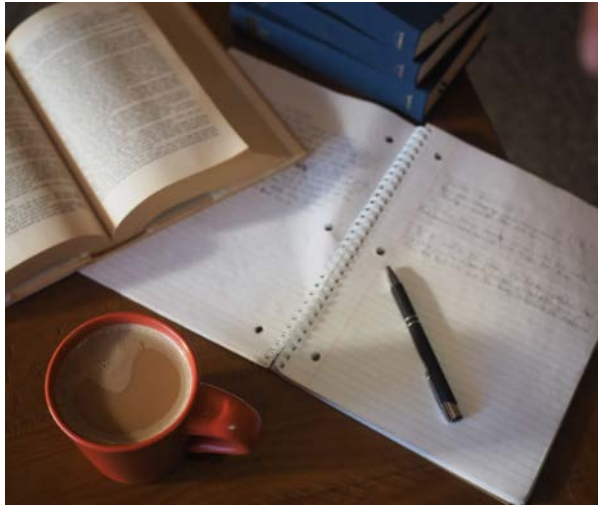

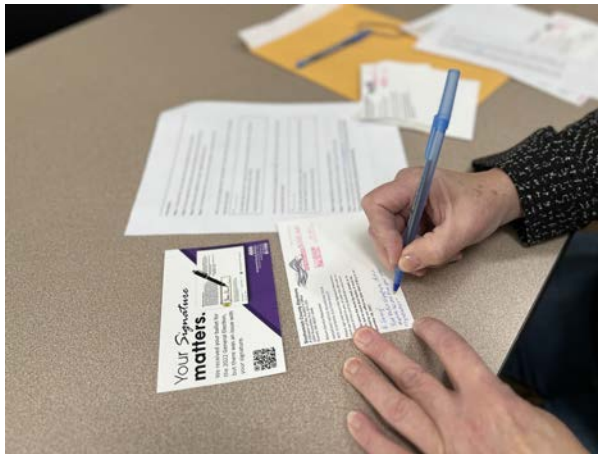
