We are very pleased to have these two non-partisan organizations co-sponsoring the Forum and Sarah serving as a very able Moderator.

Rhonda Hauff and Elaine Smith made a brief report from their attendance at the Membership and Leadership Development Training co-sponsored by the Oregon and WA LWVs in September.

# **New Members**

We are pleased to welcome new member, **Carole Folsom Hill**. Carole recently retired from the position of Executive Director of La Casa Hogar Yakima Interfaith Coalition. She has been and will continue to be a long time Yakima activist with a focus on our Hispanic community.

# **Initiative 940**

In August, the League of Women Voters of Washington endorsed **Initiative 940 Deescalate Washington** and encouraged league members to help collect the required signatures.

This initiative:

- Requires training for law enforcement in violence de-escalation, mental health and first aid.
- Provides that police should render first-aid at the crime scene.
- Applies a good faith standard for use of deadly force and removes de-facto immunity.
- Requires investigation of use of deadly force when there is death or injury.
- Brings diverse community stakeholders for development of standards.
- Includes Tribal governments when a Tribal person.

We are hoping to have a representative from the Yakima Police Department to discuss this issue at our October 24 *League Conversation*.
